How is this linked to striving? Is striving positive or negative? Through discussions and practical activities insight is gained into these concepts and their influence in daily life.

By exploring particular skills together with the concept of social interest this course offers a guide as to how movement towards the useful side of life can be achieved thus bypassing moving towards the useless side of life in today's society.
